Everyone's road to recovery is different¹

- Addiction is a complex but treatable disease that affects brain function and behavior.
- Effective treatment addresses all of the patient's needs, not just his or her drug use.
- Staying in treatment long enough is critical.
- Medications are often an important part of treatment, especially when combined with behavioral therapies.

Methadone

- Effective for people who suffer from severe and chronic pain
- Available in urban areas
- Available to pregnant and postpartum women

Buprenorphine/Suboxone®

- Does not require full detox from opioids
- Available in urban and rural areas
- Available to pregnant and postpartum women

Naltrexone/Vivitrol®/ReVia®

- Must be detoxed from opioids
- Works for both opioids and alcohol
- Person must be motivated to stop using opioids altogether
